Silverton - The unexpected death of S. Parzy Rose, 58, Saturday afternoon, April 11, came as a shock to his many business and social friends of Silverton. Mr. Rose had served as manager of the Silverton Portland General Electric office since 1930. He was active in the general progress of the town. He was born July 27, 1894, in Vinton, Iowa. He died while visiting at the suburban home of Robert Darrah, during the early afternoon, Saturday, succumbing while walking near the home, from a heart attack. Mr. Rose was married to Undine Sarah Anderson, at Sterling, Colo., in 1918. He lived in Yakima for seven years coming to Salem in 1927 and to Silverton in 1930.
