

### Farmer Union Makes Protest

The Farmers Union in Marion county is informed that President James G. Patton of the National Farmers Union has protested directly to President Eisenhower against the curb on operations of PMA farmer committeemen by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

The Farmers Union is also protesting the slash of \$110 million for agricultural conservation payments in the new budget. If Congress goes along, says Patton, it will mean the end of most lime and fertilizer payments. Patton's statement was released today by the legislative committee of the Oregon State Farmers Union.

He blasted the PMA shakeup as a "direct reversal" of promises made during the campaign that farm programs would be "genuinely farmer-run operations" and asked Eisenhower to have the PMA order recalled or revised.

The new order deprives state and county committees of their status as directors of the local PMA programs. PMA committeemen now work on a part-time basis and are paid only for the days they are actually working. Under the new set-up, their work will be done by full-time employees of the Department of Agriculture and the PMA committees will have advisory status only.
