Bonneville Gets Bids On Transmission Line

Portland (AP)—Bonneville Power Administration said today bids have been opened on one of the largest orders for high voltage power transmission lines it ever issued.

Two lowest bids on about 1,358 miles of aluminum steel reinforced 345,000-volt conductors and accessories were submitted by Aluminum Company of America, Portland, and Reynolds Metals Co., Louisville, Ky.

The material will be used for Bonneville high voltage grid lines including McNary-Ross; Chief Joseph-Snohomish lines 3 and 4, and the Snohomish-Richmond Beach section of the Snohomish-Kittitas line.
