The Cougars from Pullman won 13 events and set two meet records in outpointing Oregon State 96-34 at Corvallis. Six meet records fell at Eugene as Oregon humbled Idaho 8'-

Howard McCants and Al Fisher established the new standards in the Corvallis meet, McCants' 6-foot, 61/4 high jump went into the books as a ord, and Fisher topped his own mark for the two-mile, cover-ing the distance in 9:28.5 minutes.

Idaho, while losing to Ore-gon, set four of the six records marked up at Eugene. The Vandals' Bruce Sweeney won, the broad jump with a 22 feet. 91/2 inch leap, and was timed at 24.1 seconds in the 220-yard low hurdles. Emerson Clark was clocked at 4:25.5 minutes in the mile, and Lou Gourley ran the two-mile event at 9:37.5 seconds.

Oregon's Doug Clement was credited with the other meet records. He ran the 440 in 49.1 seconds and the 880 in 1:58.3 minutes.
