

### Call Bids for Access Road

Portland (AP)—The Portland office of the U. S. Bureau of Public Roads has called for bids for construction of the first section of a federal timber access road system from Reedsport along the Smith river to Roman Nose mountain.

The road will give access to a approximately 3,000,000,000 board feet of timber, the bureau said.

Roscoe E. Bell, regional administrator for the Bureau of Land Management for whom the road will be built, said right-of-way for the road was assured recently when an agreement was signed with the Long-Bell Lumber company giving the government right to cross Long-Bell land.

The access road will be 50 miles long when completed. The current bid invitation is for 1 miles of construction.

The bids will be opened May 7 but must be approved by the interior department before contracts can be awarded.

### Ike Meets With Security Chiefs

Washington (AP)—President Eisenhower met for two hours Wednesday with the National Security Council, the government's top policy-making unit on defense and military matters.

The session gave Eisenhower an opportunity to discuss possible new steps in the "peace offensive" against Russia.

The White House declined to say, however, whether the matter came up.

Eisenhower returned by plane late Tuesday from a golfing vacation in Augusta, Ga. He started the rest period April 13 but broke it to fly back here and open the "peace offensive" last Thursday.

### Kurt Carlsen's Father a Red

Copenhagen, Denmark (AP)—The father of Capt. Kurt Carlsen, noted skipper of the Flying Enterprise, has been refused a visa to the United States on the grounds he is a member of the Danish Communist Party, a high American embassy source said Wednesday.

Martin Carlsen, 63, a landscape gardener, and his wife were invited to America by their famous son last fall. While granting a visa to Mrs. Carlsen, the embassy turned down her husband's application.

Carlsen confirmed he is a communist. He said his wife will fly to New York alone May 3.

Capt. Carlsen won international fame in January of last year when he refused to abandon his ship, the Flying Enterprise, in storm-tossed seas off the English Coast.
