OCE President Assists Turkey
Dr. Roben J. Maaske, president of Oregon College of Education at Monmouth, returned last week to the campus from a special four-month assignment in Turkey.
The ministry of education in Turkey had previously requested the state department in Washington, D.C., to select an American teacher-educator to come to Turkey to make a survey of preservice and inservice teacher education in that country. Dr. Maaske was selected for this task and left

Oregon in mid-December, on a leave of absence granted by the Oregon state board of higher education.
While in Turkey Dr. Maaske visited a representative sampling of all types of institutions preparing teachers for secondary schools, technical schools, and elementary schools, and also studied the inservice training program for teachers in Turkey. He presented a comprehensive report and recommendations to the ministry of education for improvements in the present programs for preparing teachers for various kinds of schools in Turkey.
Of special interest to Dr. Maaske in his visits to higher institutions and public schools in Turkey was the evidence of

earnerness to learn from American educational practices and the high regard in which Americans are held generally in that country. He gave approximately 45 lectures in Ankara and some of the other cities in Turkey including Adana, Bolu, Konya, Izmir, Istanbul, Balikesir and Eski-sehir.
