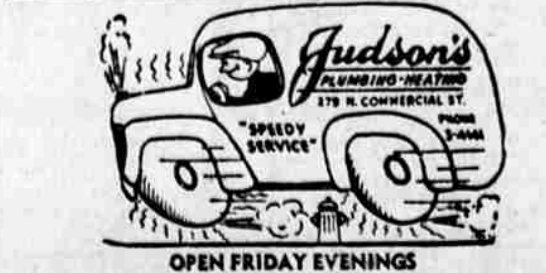

Athlete Held In Robbery Plot

Chicago (AP)—A former Marquette university player was arrested here today and held as a suspect in the "kill or be killed" \$140,000 bank robbery plot that led to a gun battle in St. Louis Friday.

Glenn Cherrick, one-time quarterback for the Milwaukee college, was arrested at his home here and held for federal authorities.

The 23-year-old former varsity star refused to talk to police.

One bandit killed himself rather than be captured and two gunmen were critically wounded Friday when 100 police closed in on the St. Louis bank during the holdup. A fourth man, believed to be the driver of the get-away car, escaped.
