Dental Bldg. Strikes Snag

Portland (P) - Unless state emergency board finds a solution to a money problem, construction of a new state dental school in Portland may

be delayed.

That is what the state board of higher education was told Monday by Chancellor Charles D. Byrne. He said the board had planned to use all of the \$2,200,000 appropriated by the legislature for construction of the new school and to use proceeds from the sale of the present building for equip-

But the board's building committee learned Monday that the joint ways and means committee had stipulated that funds from the sale of the old building be deducted from the new school's operating bud-

get. The building committee deelded to recommend that the board go ahead with its plans and hope for a ways and means committee reversal by the state emergency board.

Polish Pilot Flies for U.S.

Munich, Germany (49) -Franciszek Jarewski, a Polish Air Force pilot who escaped to the West in a Soviet MIG-15, left here Tuesday by plane for the United States.

He said he would catch a plane in London Wednesday for America, where he will take part in several Polish-American celebrations.

The 20-year-old pilot said he wanted to join the U. S. Air Force, if possible, so he could go to Korea to fight the Com-

munists.
U. S. Air Force authorities Jarewski could enlist in the Air Force after applying for naturalization papers and

then train as a crew member pending a possible commission. The MIG-15 which he flew to Denmark's island of Bornholm last month was the first such undamaged jet which Allied experts have been able to examine.




