

Young Prince Gives Arm Real Workout

Windsor, England (AP)—Four-year-old Prince Charles had a swell day practicing his salute.

For some time the manner in which soldiers greet each other has fascinated the heir apparent to the British throne, and Tuesday he had a chance to give his right arm a workout in the best military tradition.

The occasion was the presentation by Queen Elizabeth II of new standards to the royal household cavalry.

Prince Charles, in blue coat and cap, watched his mother intently, and while he didn't have an official part in the ceremony he saluted at every opportunity.

He was quite impartial, saluting the man who beat the drum, a couple of policemen and the crowds which watched the colorful parade.

Herzog Defends NLRB Decisions

Washington (AP)—Chairman Paul Herzog defended the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) from frequent charges of bias and said the five-man panel has called the shots as it saw them.

Herzog told the Senate Labor Committee in a prepared statement that the NLRB has been attacked many times by unions, as well as by employers, for rulings interpreting the Taft-Hartley Act.

But the NLRB chairman said the panel was only doing its best, grinding out 2,500 decisions a year based on a law shot through with "ambiguities," "uncertain language," and "conflicting policies." He asked Congress to clarify many sections of the law. The Senate committee is considering proposed revisions.

"The courts can reverse and the Congress can always overturn our construction of the law," Herzog said.

Army Policy Helps Oregon

Washington (AP)—Rep. Don Magnuson (D., Wash.) said Monday that an Army policy decision on out-loading of ammunition will mean capacity loads soon at Bangor, Wash., and Beaver, Ore.

He said Bangor, near Bremerton, and Beaver, on the lower Columbia River, have been declared two of the nation's safest ammunition ports from the over-all standpoint of the number of people who would be exposed to any possible explosion.

The Army informed Magnuson the first ship to load at Beaver under the new schedule is due May 4.

April loadings at Bangor were down sharply as a result of several factors, including heavy gulf port shipments.

Magnuson said the new Army directive calls for use of the safest ports to the full possible extent.

Traction Employees Voting on Contract

Portland (AP)—Some 1,200 union employees of the Portland Traction company are to vote Thursday on a tentative contract agreement reached Monday by the union and management.

Terms of the proposed contract were not announced. However, Federal Mediator Guy Lintner said agreement had been reached on "all issues in dispute." These included a pay increase, an increase in pension funds and a number of changes in working conditions.

Methodist Pastor Dies in Portland

Portland (AP)—The Rev. Charles G. Brown, 67, pastor of the Woodstock Methodist Church of Portland, died Monday at Wheeler where he had suffered a heart attack April 8.

He came here eight years ago from Coquille. Previously he had pastored at Lakeview and Toledo.

Survivors include his wife, Nellie; a son, the Rev. Frank E. Brown of Grants Pass; and a daughter, Mrs. Maxine Waite of Portland.

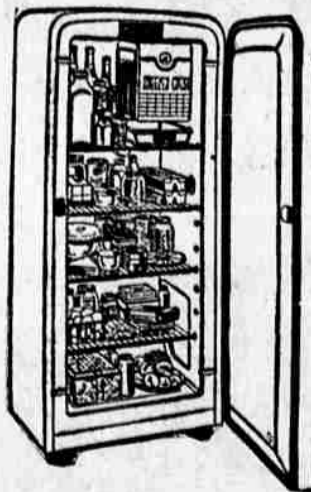
