

### Grant of \$1000 Is Authorized

Crown Zellerbach Foundation of San Francisco has authorized a \$1,000 grant to Willamette university for the academic year 1953-54, President G. Herbert Smith announces.

Purpose of the grant is to encourage and assist in completion of the undergraduate education of a student whose character, ability and field of study indicates that he will make a contribution toward industrial and social progress in the Pacific coast area.

Selection of the recipient for the Crown Zellerbach scholarship will be made by the university scholarship committee.

Eligibility requirements for the scholarship stipulate that the awardee be in the third or fourth year of undergraduate study, a United States citizen and a major in the field of physical science.
