Ingredients: 1 boneless
smoked pork shoulder butt
(about 2 pounds), ¼ cup firmly packed brown sugar, 3
tablespoons yellow horseradish

Method: Cover butt with JD Group Meets water and bring to boil; simwater and bring to boil; simmer about ¾ hour for each pound. Drain and place on shallow baking pan; if aluminum foil is at hand line pan first with the foil. Mix brown first with the foil. Mix brown sugar and mustard together well. Spread mixture over butt. Bake in moderate (350 F.) oven about 20 minutes, basting once with glaze. If slightly browned surface is de-sired, raise oven heat to very hot (450 F.) and leave ham at this temperature for 5 to 10 minutes. Makes about 5 serv-

Note: If any of the butt is leftover, it is delicious sliced thin for sandwiches with the glaze as a savory addition.


