

BLM Offering More Timber

According to a recent announcement by G. F. Horne, acting district forester, seven tracts of timber under the jurisdiction of the Bureau of Land Management containing an estimated 23,540,000 board feet of timber appraised at \$479,789 will be offered for oral bidding sale at 10 a.m., May 11, at the Salem district office at 480 North High street.

A tract in Tillamook county is being offered in an attempt to salvage 2,305,000 board feet of fire-killed timber in the Tillamook Burn. The contract for this tract will require that 155 acres be planted after the removal of the timber in order to insure the early re-establishment of the forest cover.

One of the tracts being offered is located in the Quartzville Creek drainage in Linn county and contains 5,425,000 board feet of high value old-growth Douglas fir and western Hemlock. Two other Linn county tracts being offered contain 1,415,000 board feet and 345,000 board feet of salvage timber.

Three other tracts of salvage timber are being offered, one of which is located in Lane county, the two remaining being located in Benton county.
