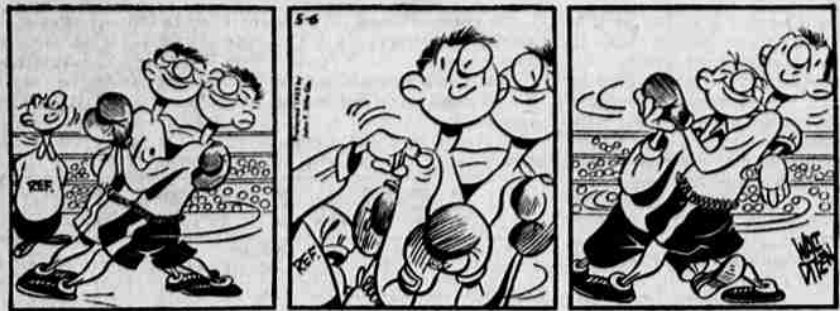

Congden Takes Lead at Halfway Point in Open

Portland (AP) — Professional Chuck Congden of Tacoma led a field of 34 finalists Wednesday into the 36-hole championship round of the annual Oregon Open golf tournament at the Columbia-Edgewater Country club.

The smooth-stroking veteran of Pacific Northwest fairways, who turned in a five-under par 67 in the opening 18-hole round Monday, carded 69 Tuesday to take the lead at the halfway point with 138.

Three strokes behind Congden was Bud Hofmeister of Hayden Lake, Idaho, who also had a 69 Tuesday. They were followed by defending champion Bob Duden, Portland, and Al Williams, Medford, Ore., tied at 140; Stan Leonard, Vancouver, B. C., 141; Bob Mc Kendrick, Portland, 142; and Bill Lee, Portland, who was low amateur, and professional Dick Lundahl, Baker, Ore., tied with 143.
