

At Least 18 Cars to Race In Stock Program Saturday

At least 18 drivers will compete in Saturday night's stock car racing program at Hollywood Bowl, promoter Henry Ireland revealed yesterday in releasing the roster of drivers registered for the event.

Portland (AP)—Bob Duden successfully defended his Oregon Open golf championship Wednesday, overtaking Chuck Congdon, the early pace-setter, in the final 36-hole round to collect the professionals' \$500 first-place jackpot.

Well back in the field during the first two days on the Columbia-Edgewater Country club course, the Portland pro cut six strokes off par in the final round and wound up with a 10-under par 278.

Congdon, Tacoma pro, who fired super golf Monday and Tuesday and led the pack entering Wednesday's round, had putter trouble and settled for 280, good for second money of \$300.

Stan Leonard, Vancouver, B.C., and Bud Hofmeister, Hayden Lake, Idaho, tied in third place at 282 and collected \$235 apiece.

Other money winners were Bob McKendrick, Oswego, Ore., 286 and \$180; Al Williams, Medford, Ore., 288 and \$160; Al Feldman, Tacoma, and Ed Hogan, Portland, tied at 289, \$115 each; John Langford, Tualatin, Ore., 290 and \$90; and Cliff Whitlie, La Grande, Ore., and Bill Mahoney, Vancouver, B.C., tied at 291, \$70 each.

Ralph Dichter, Astoria, Ore., and E. Vanderberg, Portland, were low amateurs. Each had 293.
