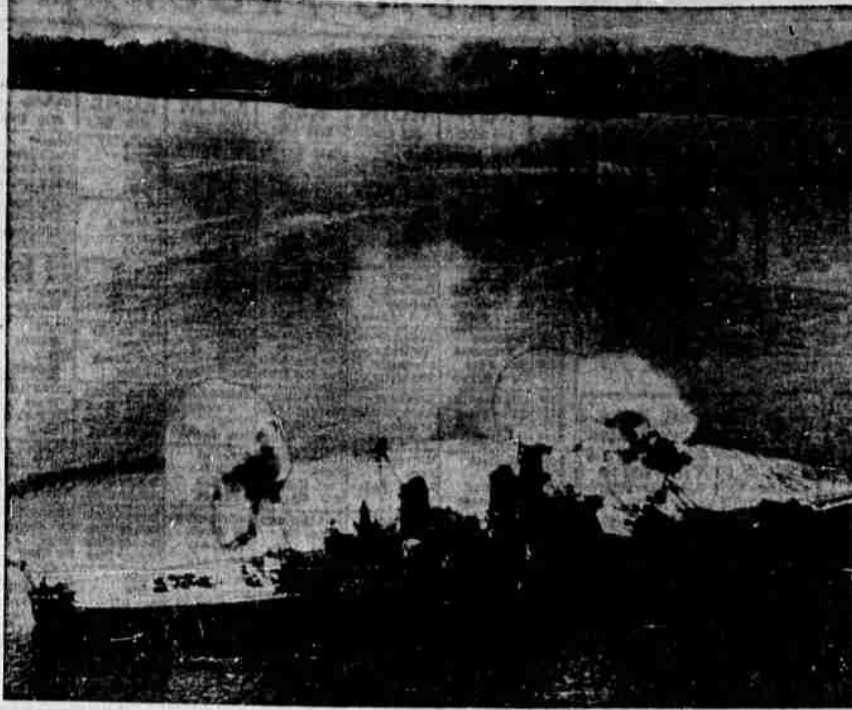


NINE-GUN BROADSIDE AIMED AT REDS
