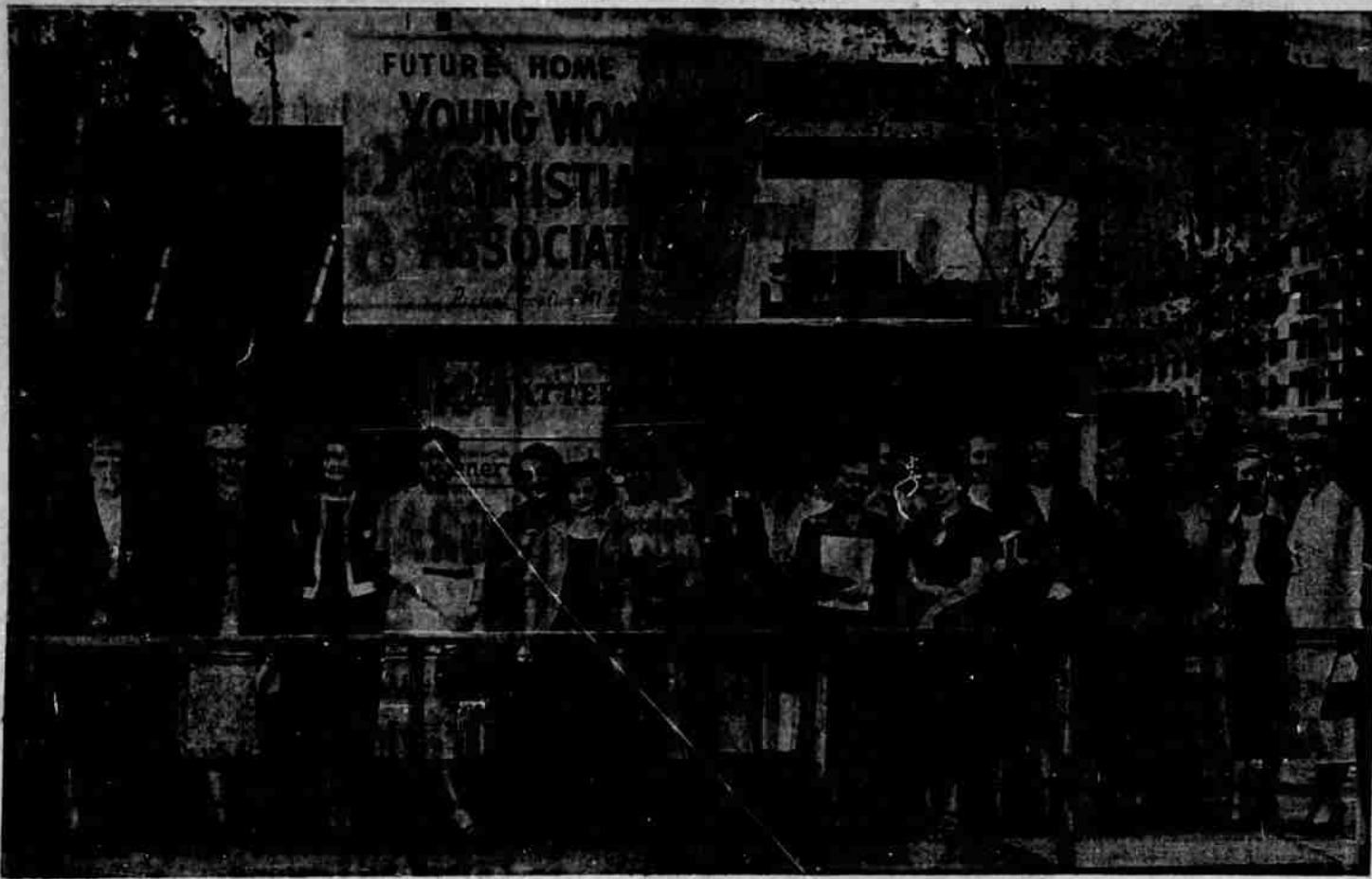


PROUD OF NEW SIGN
