Washington State Wins 3rd Straight Track Title

Eugene (AP)—Washington State college picked up its third consecutive Northern Division track crown today for its convincing victory in the silver anniversary running of the event on a soaked track here Saturday.

Coch Jock Mooberry's Cougars captured seven first places with Spriner Bob Gary leading the way with a double win in both sprints, to rack up 51 1/2 points. WSC clinched the meet in the relay when Clint Richardson outraced Oregon's Doug Clement to the wire in one of the day's best races.

Washington showed surprising strength in running events totaling 40 1/2 points while Oregon slipped to 34 1/2 in taking third. Idaho came in fourth with 20 1/2 and Oregon State fifth with 17 1/2.

Individual honors went to Idaho's Bruce Sweeney, who won both hurdles, the broad jump and tied for third in the high jump for 15 1/2 points. Oregon's Ray Packwood won the pole vault, took second in the high hurdles, third in the low hurdles and tied for third in the high jump to take second place individual honors with 10 1/2 points.
