

B'nai B'rith to Present Flag

The offer of B'nai B'rith to provide a United States flag for the new South Salem high school when that building is dedicated prior to the opening of the 1954-55 school year was accepted with thanks by the school board Tuesday night.

The directors expressed pleasure in connection with the offer of the Jewish organization.

At the same time the board decided to purchase a 12-acre tract of land from Lewis Judson for \$30,000. The land, which is without buildings, except an old barn, will be used as playground territory in connection with the Leslie junior and South Salem senior buildings.

The tract extends southwestward from 12th and Hoyt and is considered a "natural" in connection with the possible development of a football field and stadium.

A small stream meanders diagonally through the property and it is estimated that it would cost \$19,000 to take care of the water flow through a large tile. This improvement will not be undertaken in the immediate future.

The board asked for bids for a new 60 passenger school bus, a quantity of slab wood for use at the administration building and for other materials which will be needed during the 1953-54 school year.

\$139,096 Asked In Man's Death

Albany—A widow and three children are plaintiffs in a \$139,046 damage suit based on accidental death of the husband and father, filed in circuit court here Tuesday.

Plaintiffs are Mrs. Kathleen Story, 27, who is suing in behalf of herself and children, Kathleen Marie, aged 4; Christian Ann, aged 6, and one-year-old James Edward.

Mrs. Story alleges that her husband, Jim Story, was killed by a falling tree July 22, 1952.

At that time, complainant sets forth, Story was employed as a timber-bucker by the Savage Logging Company, operating a power chain saw on a road clearing project. She names the company and Athel Savage and Henry Hiebert, partners comprising the firm, as defendants. The plaintiff accuses the company of failing to employ safety measures and devices required by law on such projects.

Britons Given Dam Contracts

Walla Walla, Wash. (AP)—A British firm was awarded an \$87,600 contract Tuesday for manufacturing six transformer units for the McNary dam powerhouse on the Columbia river.

Col. F. S. Tandy, the army's district engineer, announced the award to Ferranti Electric Co., Inc., for manufacture at Hollingwood, Lancaster, England.

The award precedes by a day a re-opening at Seattle of bids for transformers for Chief Joseph dam, upstream from McNary.

An army call for rebids on the Chief Joseph project, after a low bid by a British concern, created an international "incident" recently. It included criticism of the United States policy in the British house of commons by a high British government official.

Athens, Greece (AP)—U.S. Secretary of State Dulles arrived here by air from Ankara, Turkey, Wednesday for talks with high Greek officials.

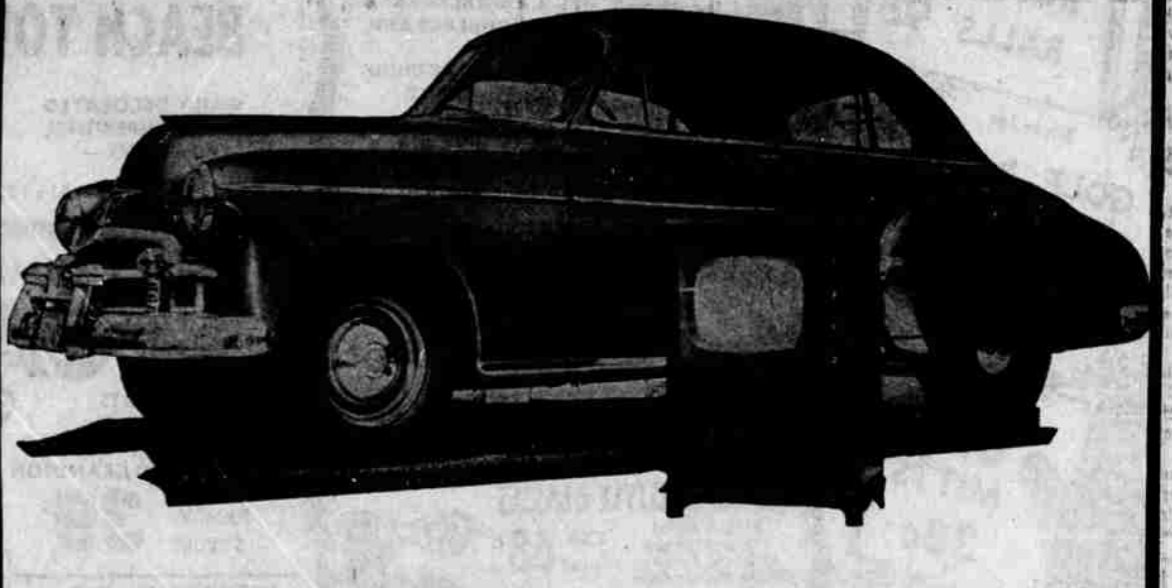
