Electric Energy in N. W. Increases

New York (AP)—Electrical energy distributed by the utility industry of the nation increased to 8,012,902,000 kilowatt hours last week compared with 7,950,054,000 kilowatt hours a week earlier.

Last week's output was 12.1 per cent higher than the 7,146,204,000 kilowatt hours turned out in the same week a year ago.

All geographic divisions showed gains over a year ago. The Pacific Northwest was up 15.2 per cent.

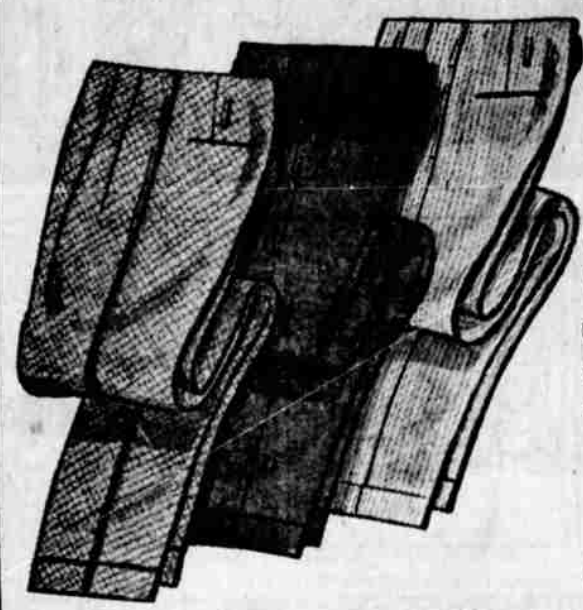


Rain COATS
