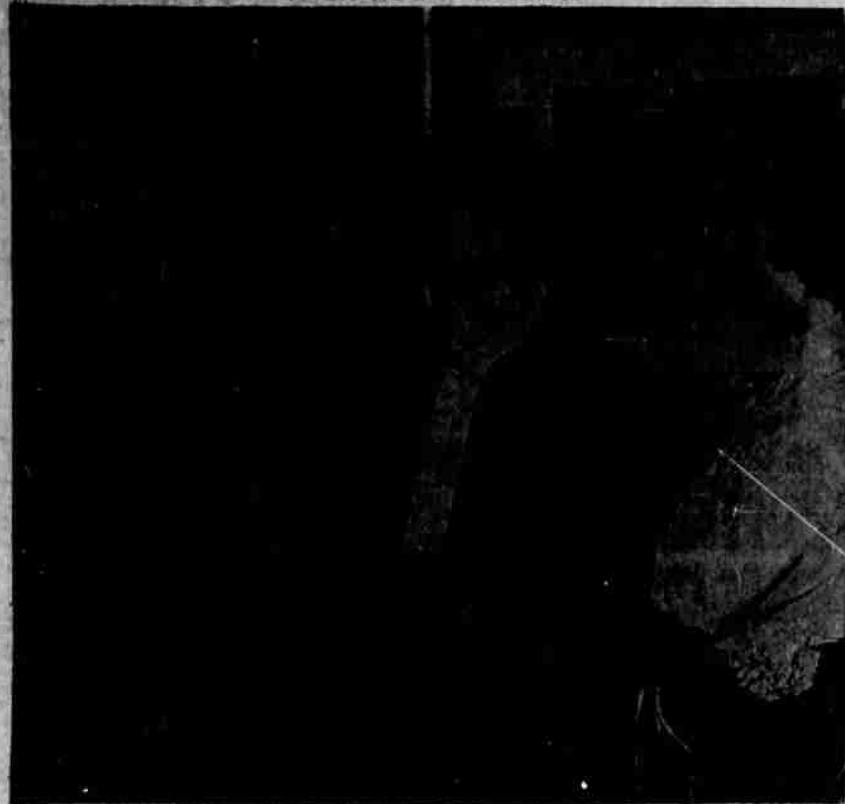

Lebanon—Annual Memorial day services will be held at the pioneer Sand Ridge cemetery at 11 a.m. on May 30. William R. Thomas, Lebanon attorney, will deliver the address.

George Simons, 84, will raise the flag, sewed by hand by his mother during the winter of 1863 when the Simons family lived on a donation land claim near Berlin. This flag, still in an excellent state of preservation, was first displayed at a Fourth of July celebration in Brownsville in 1863. It has 36 stars.

For more than a score of years, the raising of this historic family flag has been a part of the Sand Ridge Memorial day service.

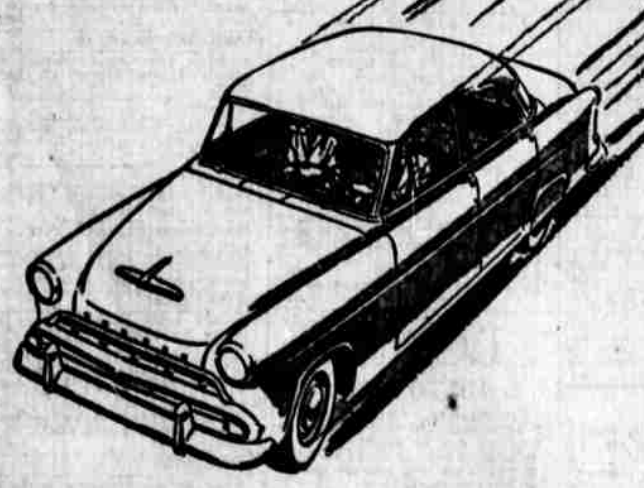
