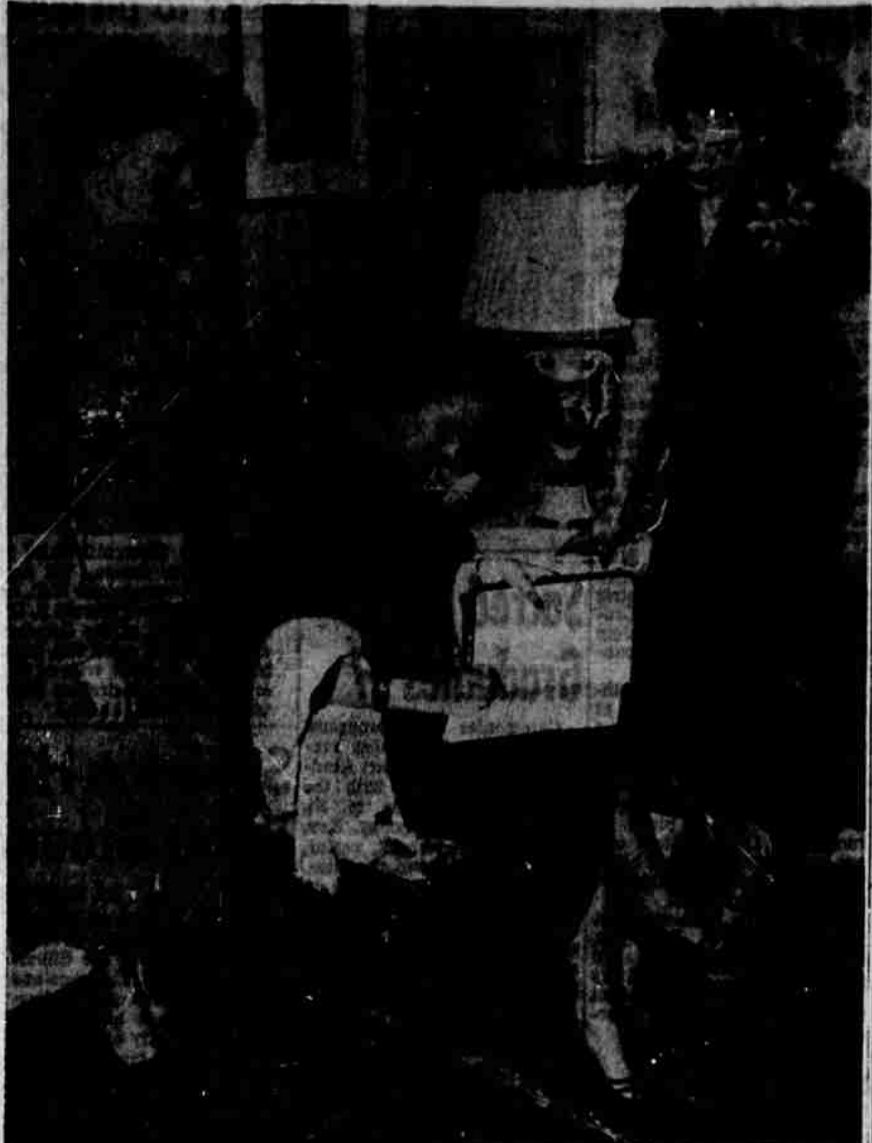
Benefit Luncheon

Raisin Chews
Ingredients: 1 cup sifted flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 1/2 cups seedless raisins, 1 cup walnut meats, 3 eggs, 1 cup sugar, 2 teaspoons vanilla, confectioners' sugar.

Method: Sift flour, baking powder and salt together. Rinse raisins; drain. Chop raisins and walnuts coarsely with sharp knife. Beat eggs vigorously until very foamy; gradually beat in sugar until mixture begins to get thick and a pale yellow color. Stir in raisins, walnuts and vanilla. Gradually stir in flour, mixing thoroughly. Pour into buttered pan (about 12 by 8 by 2 inches). Bake in moderate (350 F) oven about 30 minutes or until cake tester inserted in center comes out clean. Cool in pan; cut into 24 pieces and roll in confectioners' sugar.
