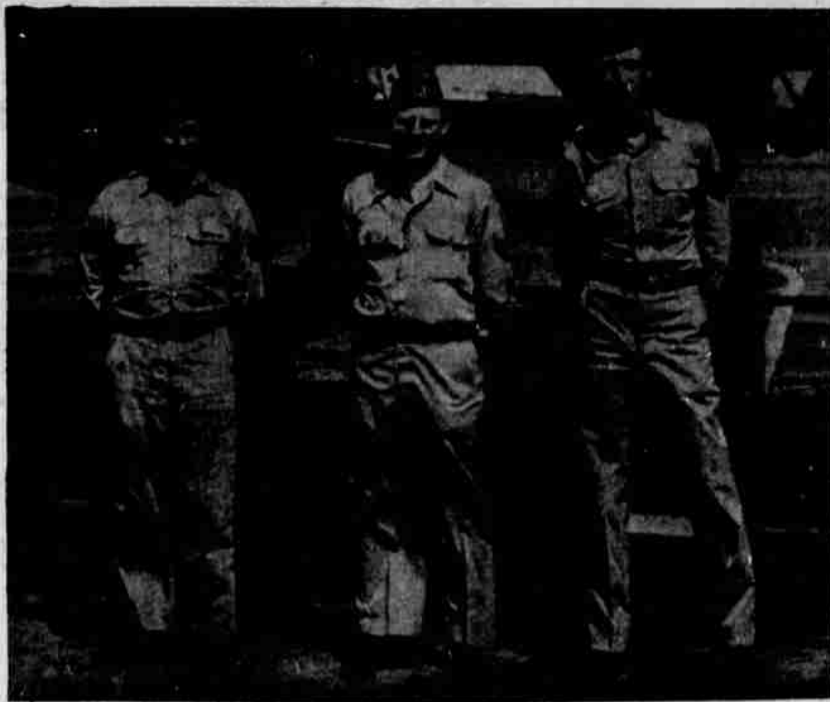


SALEM AIR RESERVISTS TRAIN

Stayton Driver Killed by Train

Turner—Death struck for the eighth time this year in Marion county traffic when a north-bound Shasta Daylight train struck an automobile killing Grady Edmiston, 27, proprietor of the Honey Bee Drive-In at Stayton, at a Turner grade crossing.

Mrs. Magdalena Elsie Edmiston, 22, his wife, was taken to General Hospital suffering from critical head injuries.

The accident occurred at C St., and the Southern Pacific tracks.

Edmiston was decapitated in the crash, and his body was thrown 132 feet from the point of impact. He was driving west in a 1949 Willys station wagon at a moderate speed, according to Clayton Taylor, William Norris and Eugene Winkle, three boys who witnessed the accident.

Funeral arrangements will be announced by the Howell-Edwards Funeral Home.

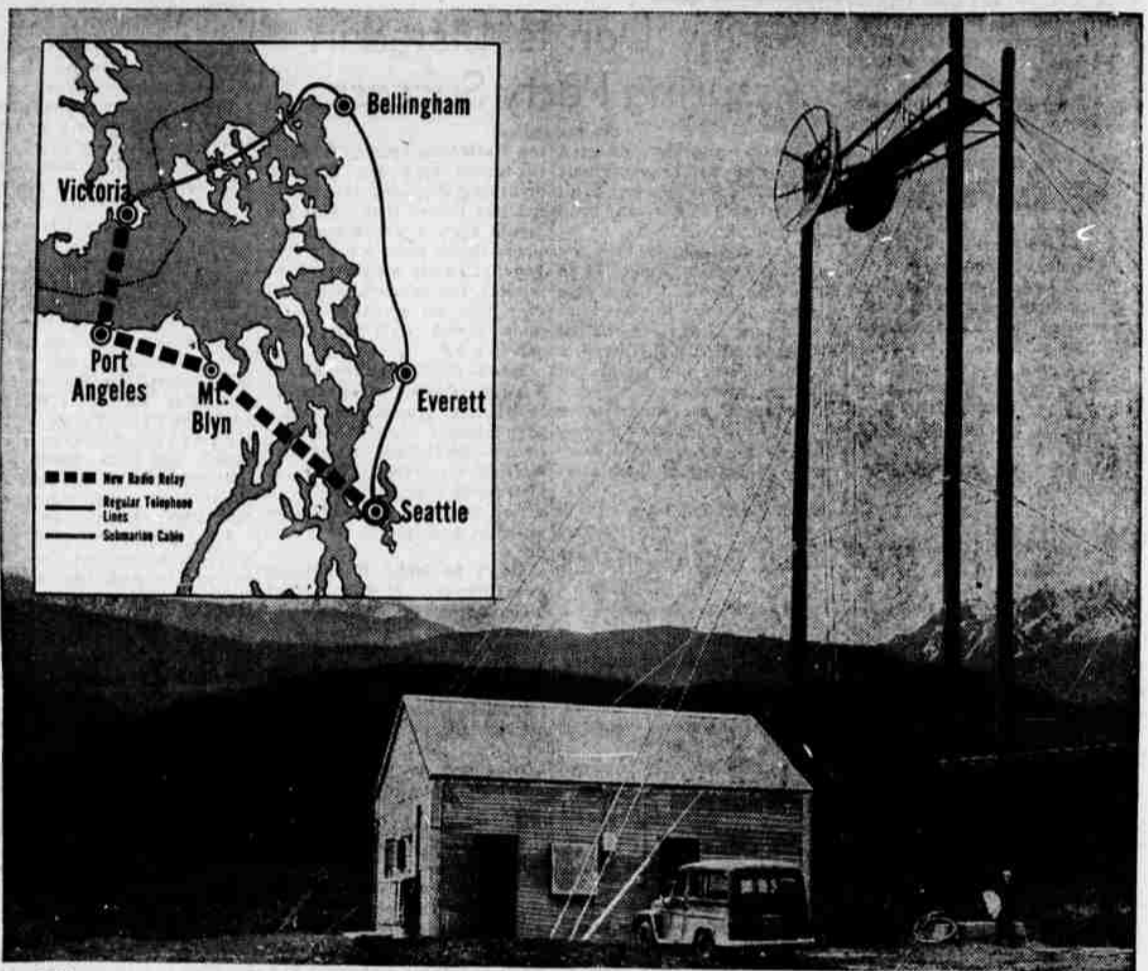
The services were held on the estate of the Cenacle Convent and Retreat House, a 300-acre Long Island property where Miss Adams once lived and which she gave to the Roman Catholic sisterhood of Our Lady of the Cenacle in 1922.

Since Miss Adams did not belong to any church, she had asked there be no ceremony. The community of 100 nuns and novices, plus a group of notables from the theatrical world, joined in a brief prayer service.

Miss Adams, who retired from the stage years ago, died last Friday at Tannersville, at the age of 80.

Long distance calls between Seattle and Vancouver Island, in Canada, are now traveling by air... beamed on microwaves from one radio-relay tower to another much as a searchlight's rays are directed.
