**Garden Salad Soup**  
Ingredients: One 1 1/2-ounce can chicken broth, one 10 1/2-ounce can condensed tomato soup, 1 medium tomato, peeled and seeded and ice (1/2 cup lightly packed, 1/4 cup lightly packed medium-grated cucumber, 2 teaspoons minced chives, 1 tablespoon cooking sherry, 1/4 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce, 1 teaspoon salt, dash of pepper.

**Method:** Chill soups. Open cans and strain chicken broth through double thickness of cheesecloth to remove fat particles; add tomato soup and beat with rotary beater until combined. Stir in tomato, cucumber and chives. Add cooking sherry, Worcestershire sauce, salt and pepper. Taste and add more salt and pepper if desired. Mix thoroughly. Serve chilled. Makes 6 servings.
