

### 3 Die in Traffic, 2 Drowned

 Three persons died in traffic accidents and two others drowned in Oregon over the weekend.  
 John Mora, Jr., 24, Hermiston, was killed outright, and a passenger, Fieldon Wayne Simmons, 44, Walla Walla, was injured fatally Saturday when their car ran off a road at Hinkle in Eastern Oregon. Another passenger, George B. Ward, 38, Walla Walla, was treated at Pendleton for critical injuries.  
 Howard Albert Delaney, 49, of Portland, was killed and two Portland men were hurt Saturday when their car overturned at a curve near Willamina.  
 Walter Schlitt, 27, of Portland, drowned at Marshall Beach on Sauvie Island Sunday.  
 Alexander Hay, 28, Portland, drowned in a lake in Eastern Multnomah county Sunday. He had been swimming and fell off a log.

### 'Soapy' Predicts Demo Victory

Eugene (AP)—Michigan Governor G. Mennen Williams is convinced the democratic party will gain congressional seats in the 1954 elections and "has laid a solid groundwork for victory" in the 1956 presidential election.  
 Speaking at a democratic picnic Sunday, Williams said the republicans now are revealing "their traditional lack of faith in the future" and "their determination to foster private interests first and public interests afterwards."  
 The young democratic governor criticized Interior Secretary McKay for "trying to give away to private exploitation," the Hell's Canyon dam site in the Pacific Northwest. This is part of a "general retreat in the administration of public power," he said.

### Shakespearean Play Staged at Ashland

Ashland (AP)—The annual Shakespearean Festival opened here Saturday night with the presentation of "Coriolanus."  
 The Elizabethan theater was filled almost to capacity despite the fact that it was the first night of television in the area.
