Mangrum Wins Tam O'Shanter By Six Strokes

Chicago (AP)—Lloyd Mangrum, who has won more money on a golf course than any other man since World War II, had another \$3,420 to pocket today for his third triumph in six years in the annual "All American" open at Tam O'Shanter.

Mangrum, never far off the pace during the 72-hole event, came through with a five under par 67 on the final round for a total score of 275, six over Byron Nelson's 1945 record, but 13 under par and three strokes ahead of his nearest competitors.

Trailing him at 278, and each earning \$2,180, were Ted Kroll, Utica, N. Y., and Sam Snead, White Sulphur Springs, W. Va.

Mangrum's victory yesterday lifted him into first place in the 1953 money winners of golf with a total of \$18,786.67 compared to \$16,604.16 for Ben Hogan, the earlier leader.

Frank Stranahan, Toledo, O., won the men's amateur for the sixth straight year with a final 70 for par 288 for 72 holes.

Patty Berg, Chicago, matched par of 76 for a 308 total to take the women's open title for the third time, having won in 1942 and 1945.

Pierce Hurls Two-Hitter As Chicago Sox Win, 1-0

New York (AP)—Trying to pick the pitcher of the next major league no-hitter is a grab-bag proposition, but a likely prospect today was lefty Billy Pierce of the White Sox.

The trim speed hurler had another near miss last night when he turned in a two-hit, 1-0 victory over Washington as the White Sox stayed five games behind the first place Yankees.

Fourth Shutout

It was his fourth shutout and his fifth low-hit game of the year. Previously he had a one-hitter, another two-hitter, a three-hitter and a five-hitter.

A ninth inning unearned run beat Washington pitcher Johnny Schmitz in a tinging duel of southpaws as Chicago retaliated for a 1-0 defeat suffered Sunday against Senator hurler Walt Masterson. Schmitz himself started the trouble when he hit Tom Wright with a pitch.

Pierce, winning his 13th game, also struck out nine to take the major league lead with a total of 124, one more than Robin Roberts of the Phils.

The Yankees had another picnic against the rag-bag Browns, pummeling them for an 18-hit, 11-3 triumph behind Whitey Ford, who didn't work very hard in achieving his 12th victory. He gave up 11 hits but contributed four singles himself.

Braves Blanked

In a rain-plagued game, finally shortened to seven innings, the Dodgers edged Milwaukee, 1-0, as pitcher Russ Meyer was his own co-star, hurling a fourth-inning and driving in the only run with a single as Brooklyn stretched its National League lead to 8½ games.

Lefty Joe Nuxhall pitched his first big league shutout winning 5-0 over the Pirates with a five-hitter at Cincinnati as Andy Seminick set the batting pace with a two-run homer and a double.

Red Schoendienst hit a triple and two singles and Enos Slaughter doubled and singled twice in a 12-hit, 8-3 victory for the Cardinals over the Phillies.
