

Salem Wins Four Straight from Wenatchee

Nicholas, Roenspie Up Win Marks in Twin Bill

By CHRIS KOWITZ, JR. The Salem Senators' two top pitchers bettered their records at Waters park yesterday as the Solons swept a double header from Wenatchee. Joe Nicholas ran his record to 19 wins and four losses as he tossed a four-hitter in the opener, won by Salem 4-2. Gene Roenspie won his 13th win of the season, compared to three losses, by pitching a five-hitter in the nightcap, won by Salem 7-2. Sunday's twin win gave the Senators four wins in two nights. Salem won a double-header from Wenatchee Saturday night, 4-2 and 8-1.

The four wins over the Chiefs brought Salem to within a half game of league-leading Spokane. The Indians were rained out of a double-header at Calgary Saturday night, and were not scheduled to play Sunday. Connie Perez hit his 10th and 11th home runs of the season for Salem over the weekend. Yakima's win at Tri-City gave the teams an even split in the four-game series. They split a twin bill Saturday, Yakima winning the first game 6-3 and Tri-City the nightcap 9-0. In other Saturday games, Vancouver edged Victoria 4-3 then was shut out 7-0; and Edmonton and Lewiston divided a pair, 5-2 and 5-1.

Washington, D. C. Girls Capture Outdoor Swim Title

(AP) — Dixie AAU officials were still counting records today after a hectic three days in which the Walter Reed Swim Club of Washington, D.C., added the Women's National outdoor swimming championship to its indoor title. With slim, 24-year-old Gail Peters setting a strong pace, the Walter Reed team amassed 84 points and set four new American records over the 55-yard Jantzen Beach pool. Miss Peters, a government employee, set national marks in two events and a meet record in another to score 24 points herself. One world's, nine American and all 11 meet swimming records were broken. It was only the second time since 1940 the meet has been held over the 55-yard distance, thus many of the marks were up for the first time in years. Carolyn Green, a 19-year-old freshman from Miami University, broke the world's mile freestyle record in 23:03.4 minutes. She also won the 880-yard freestyle title and was second in individual scoring with 21 points. Barbara Stark from San Francisco, swimming unattached, cracked two records. Judy Roberts of Indianapolis Athletic Club and Delia Muelenkamp of San Francisco each broke a mark and the Walter Reed relay team, paced by Miss Peters, broke records in two others. New Marks Pat McMormack of the Los Angeles Athletic Club easily won the titles in the one and three meter diving. She was defending champ in each event. At Bowl Tonight

Here is a sample of the stunts to be staged by the Jole Chitwood auto daredevils at Hollywood Bowl tonight. In upper picture, Francois PreFontaine, famous motorcycle specialist, performs the dangerous flaming wall crash. The show starts at 8:30.

Chitwood Thrill Show At Holly Bowl Tonight

One of the most dangerous stunts in the history of thrill shows will be attempted when the Jole Chitwood tournament of thrills comes to Salem at the Hollywood bowl on Monday night, August 10, at 8:30 P.M. This daring stunt is called the flying head-on crash. In this stunt, Jimmy Williams, a famous daredevil, wearing only a crash helmet and a safety belt for protection, will race his stock automobile down the straightway, zoom up an incline, and while flying into space crash directly into two or more cars in his path of flight. This is the same stunt which caused the death of the famous stunt driver Harold Pine of New Mexico. He was killed during the performance of the Jole Chitwood show in Ukiah, California on Sunday, June 21 of this year. Margin for error in doing this stunt is so slight that the slightest miscue on the part of the driver will bring disaster. Also included on the most amazing and exciting two hours in the history of thrill shows will be crashing stock sedans end-over-end at 60 miles an hour; motorcycle broadjumps; and stepping from the rear of speeding automobiles into pools of flaming gasoline. You will also see Rhonda Doyce, a woman daredevil form a human battering ram on the hood of an automobile as she crashes through a flaming plank wall. Featured this year will be stunt driver Harry Woolman, high-point man with the International Stuntmen association thus far in the season. His specialty is the ramp-to-ramp jump, one of the most difficult stunts of all to perform. Lucky Teter, the original Hell Driver, was killed while perfecting this stunt and Harry Woolman, who worked with Teter, has long since been considered a past master. You will see Woolman leap 110 feet through space in a new Ford sedan over a long line of other new Ford's speeding underneath, and land on a small rampway down the track. Another amazing feature will be the "human bomb"; a stunt man who will be blown up in a casket with 20 sticks of dynamite.

Since everything else was about settled today in the major league pennant races it seemed appropriate to speculate a little on who'll do the hurling when the Dodgers and Yankees meet again, and the two veteran lefties looked like good bets. The Yankees wound up their "wrap up the pennant weekend" on a negative note yesterday by losing the finale to the White Sox 5-0 on the three-hit pitching of lefty Billy Pierce, but they already had dashed the hopes of the second place Chicagoans by winning the three previous games of the series. Raschi Pitched Homer Bob Boyd hit Vic Raschi's first pitch of the game for a homer and added two more singles, driving in another run to pace the Sox to their anticlimatic triumph. Pierce pitched his 15th victory and struck out eight to take over the major league lead again with a total of 137. The Dodgers won 9-1 at Cincinnati on Russ Meyer's three-hitter and a grand slam homer by Duke Snider which sewed it up, but their lead over Milwaukee was reduced to seven games when the Braves defeated the Pirates 7-4 and 10-3.
