

# Solons Lose at Vancouver

Salem booted another chance Monday night to regain first place in the Western International Baseball League.  
The Senators, needing a single win to oust idle Spokane from the top berth, went down 5-1 before the Vancouver Capitanos and dropped a full game off the pace.  
Lonnie Myers held the Senators to seven hits as he racked up his eighth win against six losses for the Caps. Vancouver

collected nine safeties, including Jim Clark's triple driving in three runs in the third inning, off two Salem pitchers. Yakima's ace hurler, Danny Rios, took the mound as a reliever and saved a 6-5 verdict for the Bears over Victoria. Rios poured three strikes past Wayne Helbig in the top of the eighth to retire the side after the Tyees had scored two of the three runs they needed to knot the score.  
The scorers counted 19 hits

and 19 bases on balls as Lewiston lapped Calgary 25-4 in the league's only other game. There were three home runs, one each by Rocky Tedesco of the Stampedeers, and Al Horst and Ken Richardson of the Brones. Richardson had eight RBI's for the evening.  
Spokane returns to action Tuesday night as host to Tri-City. Edmonton opens at Wenatchee.
