ALBANY BOY FREED

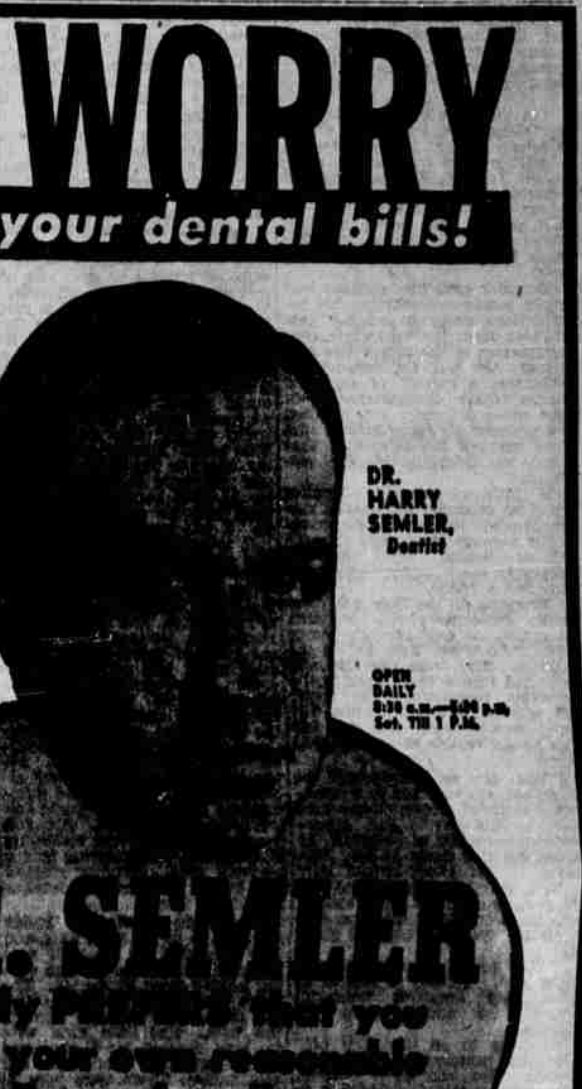
