**Seek Bids for New Substation**

The Bonneville Power Administration is calling for bids for grading the switchyard and spur track for the Santiam substation. The site of the Santiam substation is situated approximately three miles west of the town of Lyons in Linn County. The successful contractor will be required to grade the substation site and the spur track, construct a major drainage ditch, install corrugated metal pipe culvert, and install some barbed wire fencing. Bids will be opened in Portland, Ore., on Aug. 26. The successful contractor will be given 60 days to complete the work.

Following the completion of grading, BPA proposes to proceed with step 1 of the construction program for this facility, which includes the installation of a 20,000-kva 230/69-kv stepdown substation to provide service to both the Benton-Lincoln Electric Co-operative and the Mountain States Power Company for the Santiam Valley area. Present plans call for the completion of this work by the fall of 1954. In the year following, the substation will be enlarged by the addition of some 230-kv oil circuit breakers, as it will then become the major switching station for the BPA in the Willamette Valley. Two transmission lines will come to the substation from McNary and The Dalles dams, plus a connection to the Detroit dam.

He received his B.A. from Willamette in 1952. Moynihan is on the faculty of Lebanon high and Yeager is a staff member of Corcoran high school, Corcoran, Calif.

McMurray is principal of Coquille high school and Tilton is a West Linn high instructor. Cotton has been appointed to a teaching position at Grants Pass. Keiper did his undergraduate work at Northern Idaho College of Education.

**Labor Unity Suffers Blow**

Chicago, (AP)—The cause of labor unity was shaken today by the withdrawal of the powerful 750,000 man Carpenters and Joiners Union from the AFL.

The carpenters bolted the federation only hours after the AFL Executive Council approved a "no raiding" pact with the CIO, an essential step toward eventual consolidation of labor groups.

Maurice A. Hutcheson, general president of the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners, denied that the union quit the AFL because "we do not believe in no raiding agreements."

Unsettled Feuds — "We think they are all right," he said, "even with the CIO, but we believe the difficulties in our own families should be settled first."

Hutcheson said that the carpenters left the federation because of jurisdiction disputes between member unions and charged the AFL has failed to control "its own affiliates" or to curb "disruptive conditions."

**LEWIS COMMENTS**

San Francisco, (AP)—John L. Lewis says the withdrawal of carpenters from the AFL "exemplifies the fallacy of this ledum and Tweedledum policy" toward no raiding.

"The carpenters' action exemplifies the fallacy of this... policy of the AFL Executive Council in avoiding the basic question of unity and engaging in rather futile discussion of 'no raiding,'" Lewis said.

**Cut in Military Spending Doubtful**

Washington (AP) — Sen. McClellan, D., Ark., today questioned Pentagon estimates that the cease-fire in Korea may cut military spending this fiscal year by 1 to 1½ billion dollars.

McClellan, a member of the Senate Appropriations Committee, said in an interview that the nation will be lucky if it can save half a billion dollars.

"And I sincerely hope there are no actual cutbacks in our combat forces until there is an actual armistice and settlement," he added.
