New York 22-1 With a holocaust of hits, the blissing Yankees showed today what they thought of the Senators and their "all game" ball park after a 22-1 near-record victory they could have won in a corn field.

Their 28 hits were only two short of an American League mark of 30 set by the 1923 Yankees, and not rookie reliever Steve Kraly yielded a run to Washington in the eighth, they would have had a modern mark for a shutout margin.

Casey Stengel, commenting caustically that the rash of low hit games in Washington was because of the high outfield grass which kept balls from bouncing any distance, suddenly was aware that his Yankees didn't care what was out there.
