'Progressive' PWs Defended by Peiping

Tokyo (AP)—The Red Peiping radio put up a stout defense today for "progressives" American prisoners who collaborated with the Reds in North Korean POW camps.

"United States authorities are preparing to persecute repatriated American POWs who tell of good treatment during their capture," the radio said in a broadcast heard here.

"They are branding those reluctant to invent mistreatment stories as traitors and are trying by every possible means to obtain from the repatriates evidence against them."

Pilot Bails Out of Jet but Found Dead

Tokyo (AP)—A U. S. Air Force pilot Monday bailed out of his Thunderjet off the coast of Hokkaido and was rescued from the water, but was dead on arrival at a hospital, the Air Force said.

His name was withheld. Far East Air Forces said the jet crashed into the sea south of Chitose Air Base on Hokkaido, Japan's northernmost island.

5 Oregon PWs Reported Dead

One Oregon man, Cpl. Charles O. Brooks, Jr., son of Marcella Brooks, Route 1, Box 702, West Linn, Oregon, was in the official list of American prisoners of war freed Monday in the POW exchange.

The Associated Press dispatch from Musan listed Brooks from company I, 23rd Infantry regiment of the Second Infantry division.

The same day that Brooks' return was announced the department of defense released the names of five other Oregon men listed by the communists as having died in Korean prison camps.

The defense department emphasized that the reports were from communist sources and at this time could not be verified.

Oregon men on the communist list all of whom were from the Army, were:

Cpl. Julius H. Koster, son of Mrs. Elvina S. Koster, Route 4, Box 288, Albany.

Cpl. Gene Mutter, husband of Mrs. Shirley Mutter, 518 East 15th street, Eugene.

Cpl. Edward L. Keith, son of Ora Keith, Route 1, Sherwood.

Cpl. Phillip J. Todd, son of Mrs. Grace E. Todd, 603 North Fir street, Medford.

Sgt. Wilfred E. Woods, son of Mr. and Mrs. Embree C. Woods, 709 East Sherman street, Lebanon.

Pfc Koster and Cpl. Woods were both on the missing list that the Capital Journal has had on file.

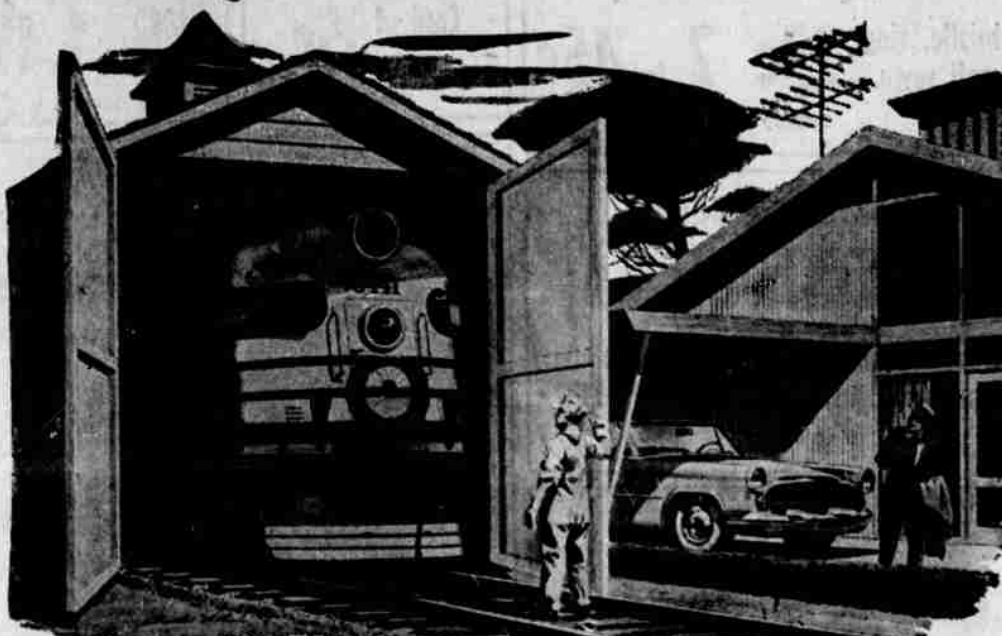
NATIONAL FOREST TIMBER FOR SALE: Oral auction bids will be received by the regional forester or his authorized representative at the office of the forest supervisor, West Postoffice Building, Eugene, Oregon, beginning at 2:00 p.m., Pacific Standard Time, September 17, 1953, for all the live timber marked or designated for cutting and all merchantable dead timber located on an area embracing about 343 acres within sections 26, 28 and 29, T. 9 N., R. 4 E., section 31, T. 9 N., R. 7 E., section 1, T. 10 N., R. 6 E., and section 6, T. 10 N., R. 7 E., W. 1/2, on Boulder Ridge between Bristol and North Santiam drainages, Willamette National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 1,225,000 board feet, more or less, of Douglas-fir and pine, 400,000 board feet, more or less, of noble fir, 20,000 board feet, more or less, of Western red cedar, and 4,300,000 board feet, more or less, of Western hemlock and other species of saw timber. No bid of less than \$11.75 per M board feet for Douglas-fir and pine, \$2.75 per M board feet for noble fir, \$2.65 per M board feet for Western red cedar and \$2.65 per M board feet for Western hemlock and other species will be considered. In addition to the price bid for stumpage, a cooperative deposit of \$0.20 per M board feet to be used by the Forest Service for paying a part of the cost of slash disposal, and a cooperative deposit of \$0.40 per M board feet, to cover the cost of tree planting, seed sowing and timber stand improvement work on the area cut over, for the total cut of saw-timber merchantable under the terms of the agreement will be required. As a qualification for oral bidding, all bidders must submit a sealed bid accompanied by the required payment to the forest supervisor, prior to 2:00 p.m., Pacific Standard Time, September 17, 1953. Sealed bids will be posted at the beginning of the auction for the information of all bidders. \$10,000.00 must accompany each bid to be applied on the purchase price, refunded or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to the conditions of sale. If an oral bid is declared to be high at the closing of the auction, the bidder must immediately confirm the oral bid by submitting it in writing on a Forest Service bid form. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. A vest service bid form for use in submitting sealed bids and full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale and the submission of bids should be obtained from the regional forester, Portland, Oregon, forest supervisor, Eugene, Oregon, or the district ranger, Detroit, Oregon, before bids are submitted.
