950 Strikers Return to Work

Seattle (AP)—The Lumbermen's Industrial Relations Committee announced Sunday some 950 striking members of the CIO International Woodworkers Union in Oregon have signed contracts which will return them to work without a wage increase.

The committee said firms involved are the Shepherd and Morse Lumber Mill at Westport, Ore., the Santiam Lumber

Co., and the Willamette National Lumber Co. Nearly 13,000 employees in about 130 Pacific Northwest companies have signed without a wage increase, the committee reported, and 8,900 employees in six companies signed for a five-cent-an-hour wage increase. Still on strike are about 1,000 men at each of two Washington firms, Simpson Logging Co., at Shelton, and the St. Paul Co. at Tacoma, the committee said.

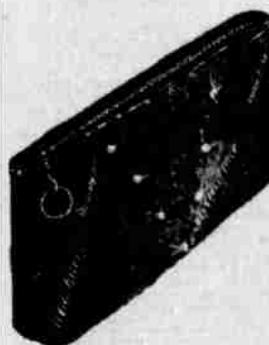

Contracts Inked For Fair Events

Contracts have been signed for two of this year's Oregon state fair major entertainment events—the rodeo and the nightly stage revue, it is announced by Leo G. Spitzbart, fair manager. Dates for the fair in Salem are Saturday, September 5 through Saturday, September 12.

In charge of staging the world's championship rodeo in the fairgrounds stadium will be one of the country's foremost rodeo organizations, Christensen Brothers, Inc., of Eugene and Roseburg, Spitzbart said. The group has earned a reputation for staging top-flight rodeos and providing rodeo stock of all types for rodeos throughout the west, including Texas. The rodeo will be held at 8 p.m., all eight days of the fair and at 2:30 p.m. Sunday and Monday.

The stage revue, presented on the rolling stage in front of the grandstand at 8 p.m., every evening of the fair, will be staged by Helene Hughes, one of the leading producers for the 20th Century-Fox organization of New York and Hollywood. Theme of the revue will be Welcome Hawaii, in keeping with this year's fair theme, according to Miss Hughes.
