**HAMBURGER BROWN-AND-SERVE SANDWICHES**  
Ingredients: 4 large rectangular brown-and-serve club rolls (about 4 inches long and 2 1/2 inches wide), 1/2 pound (1 cup firmly packed) lean ground beef, 1/2 cup grated cheddar cheese, 2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce, 1/4 teaspoon salt.

Method: Cut each roll in half horizontally. Mix beef, cheese, Worcestershire sauce and salt. Spread mixture on roll halves, covering cut surfaces completely. Bake in a greased shallow pan in a hot (400F) oven 12 minutes. Serve at once as open sandwiches. Makes 4 servings.
