Ingredients: 1/2 cup crushed macaroons, 1/4 cup top milk or light cream, 1/4 cup confectioner's sugar, 1 teaspoon vanilla, dash of salt, 1 cup heavy cream.

Method: Mix macaroons with top milk, sugar, vanilla and salt; refrigerate about 1 hour. Whip cream until stiff; fold into macaroon mixture. Turn into fluted paper cups placed in refrigerator tray. Place in freezing compartment with control set at lowest temperature. When firm, reset temperature control to normal. Makes 6 servings.
