



State Fair Racing Stalls All Assigned

All stalls have been assigned in the horse racing barns at the Oregon State fairgrounds in Salem for this year's fair racing meet September 5-12, according to Charles A. Evans, director of racing. Post time is 1:15 p.m. daily except Sunday.

With two quarter horse and eight thoroughbred races daily, there will be at least 11 purses for \$600, and 16 for \$500. No purse will be for less than \$400.

Both the inaugural handicap on Saturday the 5th and the Labor Day handicap will have \$800 purses. Purse for the Governor's handicap on Wednesday, September 9 will be \$1,000. Friday's Oregon State Fair two-year-old race purse will be \$600.

Powerful Ground Attack Wins for Staters, 21-12

Portland (AP) — A powerful attack on the ground can still win football games. That was displayed here Saturday night when the State team trounced the City eleven, 21-12, in football's 1953 debut in the sixth annual Shrine All-Star game.

The Staters, playing before more than 21,000 at Multnomah stadium, ground out 290 yards from rushing to only 76 for City.

Leading ground gainers for the State squad were Tom Crabtree of Marshfield, Miles Boardman of Bend and Fred Hall of Prineville. Directing the offense was Quincy Powers, quarterback from Marshfield.

It was the fourth victory for State against two for City in the big game. State scored once in each of the first three quarters with Boardman, Hall and Spike Hillstrom of Marshfield plunging across the goal line. Floyd Burright place-kicked the three extra points.

'Nobody From Nowhere' Wins Grand American

Vandalia, Ohio (AP) — America's biggest trapshooting championship, the \$1,500 Grand American Handicap, went Friday to Raymond A. Williams, 33-year-old furniture store employe from nearby Eaton, who cracked 98 out of 100 from 19 yards and then broke 25 straight to break a tie in a three-way shoot-off.

Thus the Grand's tradition that a "nobody from nowhere" always wins the classic was maintained. Williams broke 87 a year ago in his first try, and was among the host of duffers in the record field of 1,049. The previous high was 1,786 entrants in 1947, and last year's roaring Grand drew 1,727.

Williams won the laurels, but Harold E. Myers of Columbus, Ohio, who finished third in the shoot-off, probably won more money. Myers, a technical sergeant at Lockbourne Air Force Base, played all the options and could pick up several thousand dollars, but Williams played only two of them.

Carl L. Roberts of Wood River, Ill., finished second in the shoot-off, but didn't even hang around to await presentation of the trophy and the \$1,000 runner-up check.

Two 13-year-olds and a professional also won divisions of the big handicap yesterday.

Two other state touchdowns were called back because of penalties.

Crabtree, who picked up 93 yards for the victors, was named the game's outstanding player by a committee of coaches. Boardman was named outstanding State back and Clark Cubbage of Eugene took the top lineman's honor. Cubbage was injured late in the game.

Named on the City team as outstanding players were Leon Hittner, Central Catholic, and Roger Williams, Jefferson half-back.

Seixas, Rose Meet in Semis

Chestnut Hill (AP) — Defending champions Vic Seixas of Philadelphia and Mervyn Rose of Australia meet today in a semi-final national doubles championship match which will determine whether the tournament has its first all-American windup in five years.

Seixas, the Wimbledon king, is teamed with power-hitting Tony Trabert of Cincinnati, O., while Rose is paired with Rex Hartwig. The tandem of Rose and Hartwig is the only survivor of Australia's three-team delegation.

A semi-finals triumph for Seixas and Trabert means the pair will meet the winner of the all-American top half of the draw semi-final of Gardner Mulloy of Miami, Fla., and Billy Talbert of New York City against Straight Clark of Pasadena, Calif., and Hal Burrows of Charlottesville, Va., in the final.

Yakima Beats Denver 3-2 in Legion Opener

Hastings, Neb. (AP) — Yakima defeated Denver 3-2 behind four-hit pitching by Dave Dexter Sunday night in the opening round of the American Legion sectional baseball tournament here.

Dexter, ace hurler for the Pacific Northwest regional champions, struck out 20 men, 11 of them in a row. Four Denver errors aided the Yakima nine. Stan Williams took the loss despite pitching a three-hitter and striking out 13 men.
