Negligence Charged To Former Sheriff

Albany — Charging former Linn county sheriff, H. A. Southard, with negligence of duty, a suit asking payment of \$787.13 and costs was filed today in circuit court against Southard and the Hartford Accident and Indemnity company by Lloyd A. Cable of Polk county.

The complaint charges that in December, 1951, Sheriff Southard was instructed to attach a number of trucks and personal property belonging to Wayne Hausauer, against whom Cable had obtained judgment for \$762.93 and \$24.20 in costs in the Polk county circuit court.

The plaintiff complains that Southard failed to execute the attachment and that he negligently misplaced and lost the affidavit for attachment. The judgment was later rendered uncollectible and valueless, Cable charges.
