

### Shelton to Keep 80-Year Desk

One of the very few pieces of original office equipment that was installed in the old Marion court house back in the early 1870's, will continue to see service when the brand new marble structure is completed next spring.

The article is a flat topped table, with lathe turned legs that is in use in the office of Assessor R. "Tad" Shelton. The table was made in Salem by the firm of C. M. Parmentier and F. J. Babcock, whom a directory of the '70's describes as "manufacturers, wholesale, retail dealers in furniture, upholstery, etc., all kinds of furniture made to order and repairing promptly attended to. Coffins and caskets on hand or made to order." The firm was located in the "Commercial block" on Commercial street.

Whatever equipment the county court may see to purchase for the use of the assessor, "Tad" is firm in his decision that the more than 80 year old table will have a prominent place in his new office.

"It's just the right height and its broad surface provides room to spread the papers that are necessary in the operations of the assessor's department," explained "Tad".

To make the shift of the old table from its present location on the first floor of the temporary court house to the new structure, a bit more interesting, is the fact that Grace Babcock, daughter of the man who produced the article, is currently employed in the assessor's office and expects to make the transfer in person next spring.

### Little Plane Flies 2 Hours All By Itself

Iron, Mountain, Mich. (AP)—A small, 8-year-old airplane was resting in a treetop Monday after showing its frantic owner it could fly pretty well without him.

The little Aeronca two-seater kept this community rubber-necking skyward for nearly two hours Sunday as it circled lazily 4,000 feet overhead after leaving owner Walter Warner staring dumfounded at its departing tail structure from the runway of Ford Airport.

### Lifesavers in 32 Counties

At the end of six months of organization work the Highway Lifesavers committee of Oregon Citizens report a citizens' statewide movement well underway to reduce fatalities, injuries and property damage resulting from highway traffic accidents.

The organization was launched February 16, 1953, at a meeting in Portland called by E. C. Sammons, president of the United States National bank, followed by a series of county meetings and conferences with official traffic safety officials, law enforcement officers, state highway commission members, the Oregon Safety Council and others.

Chairmen have been named in 32 of the 36 counties in Oregon.

### Farmers Union Adds To Hells Canyon Fund

The executive committee of the National Farmers Union has made a donation of \$500 to the National Hells Canyon association. Announcement of the gift was made by President James G. Patton in Denver. In addition to the gift of the national organization, contributions to the Hells Canyon defense fund have been made by two state Farmers Union organizations — Oregon and Montana. Oregon has raised over \$700 and contributions from members are still coming in.

The National Farmers Union has also intervened in the Hells Canyon hearing, now in recess, before the Federal Power commission.
