'Boss' Convict Held At Rocky Butte Jail

Portland (AP) — The convict who Warden Clarence T. Gladden referred to as the "boss convict" at the Oregon State Prison is being held in Rocky Butte jail here.

He is Donald Everett Bailey, 39, serving a 25-year sentence for the holdup of a Portland department store in 1947. Bailey has been here since July 20—a week after the convict rebellion at the prison had been quelled.

A prison official who asked that his name not be used said he believed Bailey had organized the three-day rebellion and given the signal for it to start. Bailey, however, did not take part in the disturbance

and was among those who remained in their cells.

Bailey, characterized by the official as "highly intelligent, completely criminal and an extremely aggressive man," until six weeks ago was chief inmate clerk in the control room, the central office inside the prison walls. The official said Bailey used this post to operate prison "rackets."

Deputy Warden L. R. Barnes said Bailey had been transferred to Rocky Butte jail because "we want to find out with whom he had influence."

Bailey, in an interview said, that charges which prison officials made against him "should be proved in court."

"Undoubtedly there are a lot of things going on in the prison, but why they connect me with them, I don't know," he said.

First public reference to the "boss convict" was made at Friday's Board of Control meeting. Gladden described his activities and said they were one of the reasons he needed additional guards.

Later Gladden identified the "boss convict" as Bailey.
