Washington (F) — The Air Force will have to drop about 6,600 reserve officers, it says, regardless of whether some of them may be inconvenienced by early return to civilian life. About 12,500 reserve officers will be let out in the next 60 days, with an estimated 6,000 ending their service voluntarily, to make way for young men coming out of the Reserve Officers Training Corps program. The Air Force announced several weeks ago that the action would be necessary. Air Force spokesman said last night they have received reports that an undetermined number of reserve officers being dropped will be put to some personal inconvenience.
