

Vogeler Sues For \$500,000

New York, (AP)—Robert Vogeler is suing his former employers, the International Telephone and Telegraph Co., for a half million dollars. An official of the firm says he is at a loss to explain why the one-time prisoner of Hungarian Communists brought the suit.

Vogeler, who spent 17 months in prison in Hungary on an espionage charge, was an executive of I.T.&T. during that period and left the firm the first of the year.

Jacob Rosenberg, attorney for Vogeler, said he had filed papers and served a summons in the suit against I.T.&T. and a subsidiary, the International Standard Electrical Corp.

Rosenberg said he had not yet filed a complaint and declined to disclose details of the suit. He said only that it dealt with the period of Vogeler's imprisonment and was not a salary matter.

A. M. McClennan, assistant vice president of the company, said he knew of nothing in Vogeler's relations with the firm to "justify a suit."

Woman Admits Check Charge

Louise S. Myers, mother of two children, who said her home was in Aurora, Colo., but who came to Salem from Los Angeles via Lane county and who is charged with obtaining money by false pretenses, pleaded guilty to the charge in circuit court Monday afternoon.

noon. Judge George R. Duncan placed the woman on two years probation with the understanding that she make restitution.

Counsel for the defendant said that his client had admitted to issuing several worthless checks in California and Oregon, but that her parents who live in Colorado were prepared to make restitution.

on a charge of burglary not in a dwelling.

Raymond John Righenour was indicted by the grand jury charged with intent to kill as the result of the death of John Melton, Western Logging company employe the night of July 18.

Counsel for Righenour filed a demurrer to the indictment, arguments on which were scheduled for Tuesday afternoon.

Black Market In POW Camps

Inchon, Korea, (AP)—Repatriated Americans predicted today returning officers would expose a vicious black market which peddled precious food while hundreds died of hunger in a prison camp. "The officers promised that they were going to turn in the men responsible when they got back to freedom," said Sgt. Buford McNamara of Memphis, Tennessee. "They were plenty mad about it and probably would have stopped it but the Chinese shipped them off to another camp first." McNamara said the black market was run by a handful of American cooks who were picked by the Chinese to prepare the meager rations of food offered to the POWs.

"We would get some of it," he said, "but they would sell a lot of it for military script, tobacco, rings, watches — anything they could get."

Low-Rent Housing Units for Reedsport

Washington, (AP)—The Public Housing Administration reported Monday that it had approved construction of 14 low-rent housing units at Reedsport, Ore. Reedsport is one of 49 cities and towns in the nation to be allocated a portion of the 20,000 units that Congress has authorized for construction this year.

Youth Sent to State Hospital

At the request of the defendant himself, 17-year-old Raymond Wallace Satterlee, indicted recently for manslaughter in connection with the death of a 4-year-old companion August 4 in the Pratum area, was sent to the Oregon state hospital for observation when he appeared before Circuit Judge George R. Duncan Monday afternoon.

The commitment is for a period not to exceed 30 days. Mrs. George Williams, foster mother of Satterlee, consented to the commitment for psychiatric observation. The 17-year-old youth appeared serious and answered all questions put to him by Judge Duncan in a straight forward manner.

Following his stay in the hospital Satterlee will be brought back into court for further consideration.

The remaining 11, four sons and seven daughters, and their husbands and wives, children and grandchildren, have established their homes in the three Pacific Coast states. They will travel to the reunion from as far north as Olympia, Wash., and as far south as Oakland, Calif.

Largely responsible for organizing this affair is a daughter who lives at Salem, Mrs. Ethel Marsh, 570 Gaines St.

Expel Carpenters From AFL Councils

Washington, (AP)—AFL President George Meany today ordered AFL Building Trades Councils in all cities to expel locals of the rebellious Carpenters Union.

He retaliated against the carpenters two weeks after the 800,000-member union led by William C. (Big Bill) Hutchison quit the AFL because of a dispute between Hutchison and national AFL leaders.

Meany instructed all state and city AFL branches to "disassociate and suspend" the carpenters, many of whom hold key positions in local councils as well as in state federations.
