

### Marine Captain Stationed Here

Salem visitor Tuesday was Capt. W. F. Simlik, U.S. Marine Corps, who August 28 takes over the duties of PIO for the U.S. Marine Corps recruiting station, Portland.

The captain only recently returned from 14 months of duty in Korea with the Fifth Marines of the First Marine Division as regimental operations officer and company commander. He will replace Capt. A. S. Bailey as PIO.

Bailey, who, when he came to the PIO assignment 26 months ago, also came from duty with the Fifth Marines of the First Marine Division, goes to duty in Washington with the personnel department of the Marine Corps Headquarters. He reports there late in September.

The new PIO, whose area covers the entire state of Oregon and part of northern California and southern Washington, has spent 10 years with the Marine Corps, including active duty and service as a reservist. During World War II he was in the Pacific with

### Antique Autos New Feature

Another entirely new feature of this year's Oregon State Fair in Salem, September 5-12 will be a display of one of the most unique collections of antique and original racing and pleasure automobiles in the country, it was revealed here today.

Among cars to be brought here from California for the show will be a 1899 Locomobile steamer, a 1901 Crestmobile with leather strap crank, a 1902 curved dash Oldsmobile, a 1901 and a 1907 Baker electric with Victoria top and a 1901 Darracq (French make). One of the most interesting will be the world-famous 1911 Rolls Royce that belonged to the late Czar Nicholas of Russia, valued at more than \$20,000.

Racing cars will include a 1913 Peugeot, winner of the Indianapolis, Santa Monica and San Francisco races in 1916 and valued at \$25,000; a famous 1917 Hudson, the Black Widow and Spider Ford 1914 racers; a 1912 Cadillac racer of the Mercer Speedster and Stutz Bearcat type and a 1908 Benz that was driven by the famous Barney Oldfield. A 1914 National sports roadster and a 1915 Model T Ford towing car will be included in the display.

### School Bonds Interest High

The Salem school district will pay a total of \$645,000 in interest charges on \$2,000,000 worth of serial bonds during the 20 year period of the issue.

This was determined Tuesday night when bids from three separate groups were opened by Clerk C. C. Ward. The bid of the First National Bank of Portland and associates, with an effective interest rate of 3.0714 per cent was accepted. There was no premium involved.

The rate to be paid annually ranges from 2c to 4 per cent, with a total interest cost to the district of \$645,000. Halsey Stuart & Co. and associates bid 3.18309 for the issue or a total interest charge of \$665,000, while the U.S. National Bank of Portland and associates bid 3.196428 for a total interest charge of \$671,250.

The bid is considered a favorable one insofar as the district is concerned, although the interest rate on the 1 1/2 millions sold a few months ago was 2.71 per cent. The money will be used in the construction of the new South Salem senior high school. The voters authorized a total issue of \$4,280,000.
