Atkins pitched his bob-tailed masterpiece against the San Francisco Seals last night as he humbled the hitless heroes 2-0 in the seven-inning opening game.

Moran Breaks Spell - Then Ferrarese took over for the regulation distance nightcap and didn't give up a hit until one man was out in the eighth inning. Jim Moran broke the spell with a hit and eventually scored, but the Oaks won that game, too, 7-1.

New York, (AP) - Young Ed Mathews probably won't reach the golden goal of topping Babe Ruth's 60 homers in a season, but he had an outside chance today to beat the National League mark of 56, set by Hack Wilson of the 1930 Cubs.

Mathews, the free-swinging Milwaukee sophomore, was only two homers behind Ruth's record pace of 1927 today after drilling Robin Roberts, the best pitcher in baseball, for his 40th homer at Philadelphia last night. But from now on the tempo must quicken, since Ruth set a blistering pace in which he hit 17 homers in his last 27 games in the month of September.

Killing Pace - Psychologically, that pace has knocked many an aspirant out of the race for all-time home run honors, and it probably will be too much for the 22-year-old kid from Texas, Tex. But he has a better chance to top the Wilson mark.

It was just 23 years ago today that Wilson set a new National League mark with his 44th homer.

Mathews would have to hit 17 more to top Wilson's mark, since he is four behind him at this stage, but Wilson in the final days of the campaign, tailed off and this muscular young kid looks like he might just be getting his second wind.

Roberts, though touched for a homer and single by Mathews, gave up only five hits in achieving his 21st victory in the opener 6-1. The Braves took the second game, 6-2, Lew Burdette going the route for his 13th victory.

Dodgers Maintain Lead - The Dodgers stayed nine games in front of Milwaukee by defeating the Cubs 6-5 as Jack Robinson highlighted a five-run eighth with his second homer of the game with two on, after Chicago took the opener 3-1 on the steady pitching of Bob Rush and the hitting of Clyde McCullough, who drove in all the runs with a homer and double.

Cincinnati topped Pittsburgh 8-6 and 9-8, winning the first game on a two-run pinch-homer by Bob Borkowski and the second on a two-run homer by Roy McMillan. The Giants ended a seven-game losing streak when Ruben Gomez pitched a four-hitter for a 3-0 triumph, but the Cardinals won the second game 9-2 as Gerry Staley pitched five-hit ball for his 16th victory.
