Sportscaster Bill Stern is now a panelist on the television show, "Name's the Same," a quiz panel program seen on KPTV Tuesday evenings at 5 p.m. In this role he joins panelists Carl Reiner and Joan Alexander in trying to deduce the identities of guests with odd or famous names. Robert Q. Lewis is the emcee.

Born in Rochester, New York, in 1907, Stern earned a B.S. degree at Pennsylvania Military College where he was also noted in football, basketball, tennis, boxing and crew. After graduation he did some announcing, played stock and made a dismaying assault on the walls of Hollywood, where the closest he could get to a movie lot was by digging post holes.

In 1931 Stern became assistant stage manager of New York's Roxy theater. The old lures of the mike and the sports arenas still persisted, though, and since 1934 Stern's flair for the dramatic and for human interest angles has made him a kingpin in sportscasting.

Stern is also featured on KPTV's program, "The Big Playback" Monday evenings at 10:30 p.m.

Oregon's capital city is to be on television.

Date of the city's appearance is uncertain yet by Tuesday and Wednesday Bob Harris of TV Productions in Seattle was here taking shots of the city.

Harris is doing a series of 15-minute sketches of Northwest cities which will appear later under the heading of "Northwest Neighbors" and be sold to television stations.

Tuesday's shots were of Willamette university; the capitol building; residential areas in Candelaria Heights and on Summer and Winter streets; the new bridge across the Willamette and the approaches at the West Salem end; street shots of shoppers and business places; the administration building at the Salem Airport with the arrival of the United Air Lines plane and the presentation of the fruit and nuts bound for Hawaii to advertise the Oregon State Fair; and Salem's Naval Air Facility, where Naval Air Reservists train.

Wednesday Harris was taking the McLaren school at Woodburn; a couple of other state buildings; a panoramic photo of the city of Salem from the Livesley building; more shots of the bridge across the Willamette and the Blue Lake and Paulus brothers canneries.
