McGriff has witnessed hundreds of accidents on the speedway, and none of them "scared him out" before. But the sight of a man running while burning to death was enough to cause McGriff to quit racing—for good. Lucky Glascock, who was involved in the fatal crash, but who escaped with only minor burns, has hung up his safety helmet for keeps, too.


