### Dusty Rhodes Hits Three Home Runs for NY Giants

New York (AP)—The annual August-September salary drive was on in earnest in the Major Leagues today as some of the boys on the also ran ball clubs try to impress their bosses and earn raises next year.

With the pennant races all but over, the players were looking to their own averages and other marks with more concern than whether their teams are winning or losing.

**Obscure Performers** Such obscure performers as Dusty Rhodes of the Giants, Hal Jeffcoat of the Cubs and Dave Philley of the Athletics were impressive yesterday in leading their second division teams to triumph over first division opponents.

Rhodes became the first player this season to hit three home runs in a game as he paced the Giants to a 13-4 victory over the Cardinals by batting in five runs. He became the 101st player in Major League history to whack three in a game. His batting average was a measly .167 and he had hit only three home runs previously during the entire season.

The Cubs squared accounts for much of the rough treatment they have received in Brooklyn this year when they also beat the Dodgers, 13-4, on 15 hits, including two homers by Jeffcoat and one by Bill Serena. Jeffcoat had hit only two homers previously this season. It was Brooklyn's worst home defeat.

**Bums Drubbed** However, the Dodgers remained nine games ahead in the National League race when the second place Milwaukee Braves dropped a 6-5 verdict to the Phillies in a night game. The Yankees boosted their lead to 10 1/2 games in the American league by topping

It was announced today by Business Manager Jim Barratt. Barratt said that tickets allocated to Salem are in the best seating location ever received in that city, and advised ticket seekers to purchase them early. The tickets will go on sale at Wicklund's on Monday, August 31, same day the Beavers open fall drills.

The Beavers meet California in Portland on September 26, and return to that city on October 10 for a date with Stanford. Lone Corvallis encounter will be the Homecoming game against WSC on November 14. Oregon State will dedicate its new football stadium, Parker field, on that day, with a capacity crowd of 25,000 expected.
