Washington & — Prices received by farmers declined four-tenths of one per cent between mid-July and mid-August, the Agriculture Department reported Friday.

Its index prices received declined to 255 per cent of the 1910-14 average. This was 13 per cent less than the index of 295 in mid-August, 1952.
