

Jordan Plans Basin Project

Boise, (AP)—Gov. Len Jordan says no real progress can be made in long range project planning in the Columbia Basin "until we bring all interested parties together around a conference table."

He gave his views in a letter to Marshall N. Dana, assistant to the president of the United States National Bank of Portland, released by his office Thursday. Dana had asked his views on resource developments.

In the letter, Jordan outlined his proposed plan for a committee on power develop-

ment. He said he favored setting it up within the framework of the Columbia Basin Interagency Committee.

"In my opinion such a committee should consist of one member only from each of three federal agencies: Interior, Army Engineers and Federal Power Commission, the governors of the basin states: Oregon, Washington, Montana and Idaho, together with their respective compact chairmen; the three basin states of Wyoming, Utah and Nevada to have equal representation on specific planning involving the waters of the states; and a representative of each of the utilities now owning facilities within the basin," he wrote.

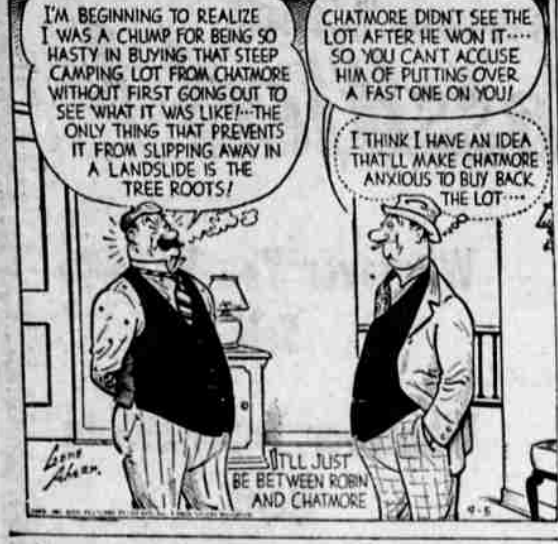
