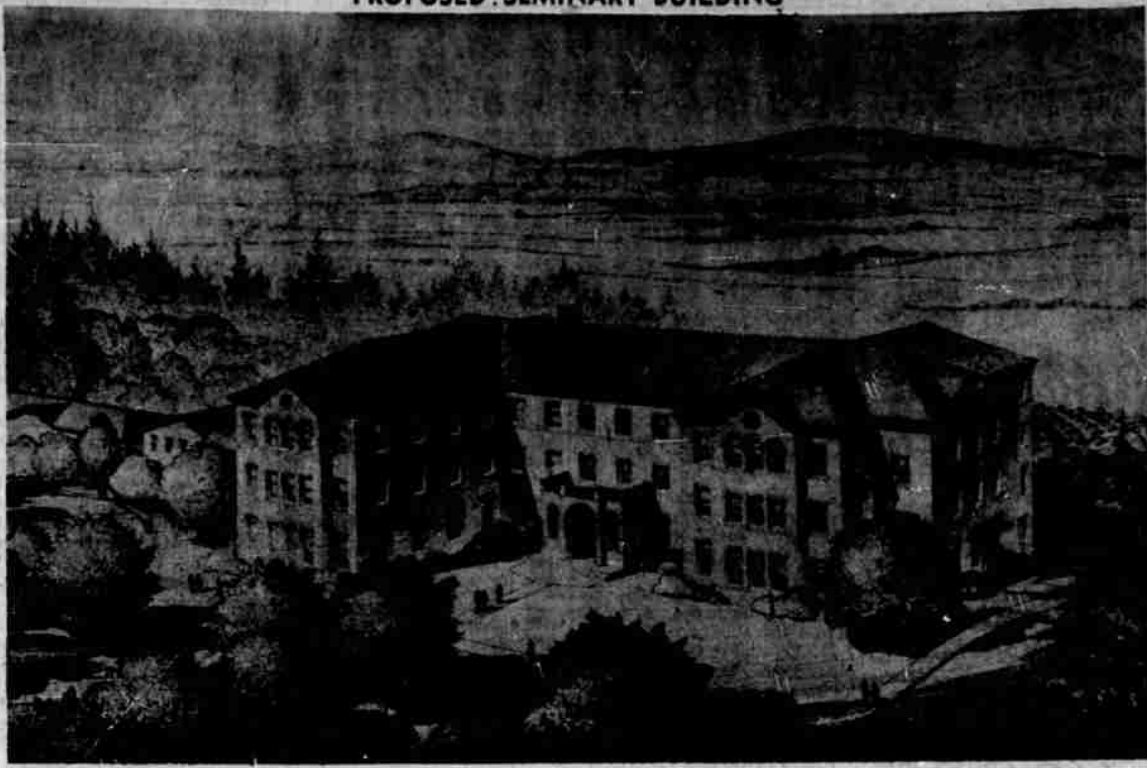


PROPOSED SEMINARY BUILDING

Plans Approved For New Building at Mount Angel

Mt. Angel — Preliminary plans of Architect Louis Scherber, for the new residence hall to be constructed at Mt. Angel Abbey seminary, were released this week. To cost \$600,000 the building is three stories and is designed to house 180 students. It includes administrative offices, dormitories and private rooms, three reception rooms, athletic and recreation rooms, an office and suite of rooms for the Rector, and a suite of rooms for two prefects.

The tiled roofed structure will carry out the Romanesque style of architecture of the present buildings. It will be fireproof, and will be built of reinforced concrete with a brick veneer exterior. Classrooms and study halls will be acoustically treated. It will be erected directly west of the present Seminary building, facing on the mall.

According to the Rt. Rev. Bernard Sanders, rector of the Seminary, "the full size basement will be used for recreation rooms at present. When the old building is remodeled, these rooms will be converted into classrooms."

Construction on the residence hall will begin as soon as bids are approved. "It must be ready for occupancy for the Fall of 1954, if we are to avoid turning away candidates for the priesthood, as we have had to do this year," Abbot Jentges of Mt. Angel Abbey stated.

Jet Bombers Fly in National Air Show

Washington (AP) — Fifteen Air Force B47 Stratojet bombers will sweep over Dayton, O., for the National Air Show tomorrow in a brief detour on a flight from England to Florida.

The Air Force said it will be the longest nonstop operational jet training flight on record. The planes will refuel in the air from KC97 flying tankers.

The Stratojets, the world's fastest medium bombers, will average about 435 miles per hour on the 11 1/2 hour, 5000-mile flight.

Holmer Goes To New York

A. Freeman Holmer, associate professor of political science at Willamette university, and director of the Oregon Citizenship Clearing House left for New York Saturday where he will attend a meeting for directors of 10 citizenship clearing houses.

The conference will be held at New York University and Chief Justice Arthur T. Vanderbilt of the New Jersey supreme court will act as chairman for the group while planning the year's program.

Willamette was named headquarters for the Oregon Citizenship Clearing House in May. The program, originated at New York University in 1947 by Justice Vanderbilt, is designed to encourage the nation's young college students and graduates to participate actively in political affairs.

Following the citizenship meeting, Holmer will participate in the American Political Science Association's 49th annual meeting in Washington, D.C., September 9-12. Holmer is a member of the panel discussing "The presidential nominating process in 1952."

Essay Contest For Students

Salem area school age youngsters will have an opportunity to participate in a nation-wide essay contest offering a total of \$50,000 in cash prizes, the Salem Chapter of the Disabled American Veterans announced today.

In conjunction with the broadcast, "I Was a Communist for the FBI," sponsored locally by Stevens and Son, Jewelers, the contest will be held September 13 through 30. Draft Call Issued for 23,000, November

Washington (AP) — The Defense Department today issued a draft call for 23,000 men in November, all to be assigned to the Army.

The November call, which is the same as draft calls every month since July, reflects a change in policy by the Defense Department on manpower levels.

Draft calls originally had been expected to fall to about 19,000 starting in November as the result of the Korean truce and lower manpower goals.
