Lebanon — The Southgate shopping center has been selected as the name for the proposed development on highway 20 west of Cascades Plywood plant, according to announcement made Friday by Fred Cubbison, real estate broker promoting the project. He said that John Lewis and associates of Worthington, Minn., have been retained to install the center. The firm is experienced, said Cubbison, and has put in shopping centers in various states including a \$12,000,000 installation in Minneapolis. Representing the firm in Lebanon is Ralph R. Brunner. Cubbison also said bids were being solicited for a half-million feet of blacktop for the parking area and road, 4,000 yards of fill, and 18-inch pipe for the ditch between the highway and the proposed center. Revised plans now set the opening for early spring.
