Highest Bid By Philomath

In lively competition for over nine million board feet of Bureau of Land Management timber in Lobster Valley, 174 bids were made before the Philomath Lumber company succeeded in topping offers of the Yew Creek Logging company of Corvallis at an oral auction sale conducted by Salem District Forester Rodney O. Felty on September 4.

Felty noted that the greatest number of bids made in any previous single oral auction sale was 121 for an offering two years ago. The final price after four hours of bidding for the Lobster Valley tract, which is located south of Alsea, in Lane county, was \$28.10 per thousand board feet for the Douglas fir, with \$8.40 and \$7.95 per thousand, respectively, for western hemlock and western red cedar.

Williamette Valley Lumber Company was successful in submitting the high bid for six smaller tracts in Polk and Linn counties. Strong competition by the Round Top Logging company resulted in bids of from \$3 to \$10 above the appraised prices per thousand board feet on three of the tracts.

Other successful bidders for timber offered by the Bureau of Land Management at this sale were Johnson and Page of Newberg, Dwyer Lumber company of Portland, Diamond Lumber company of Portland, and M & M Wood Working company of Albany, each of which was the successful bidder for one of the total of eleven tracts offered. Total price bid for the 25,080,000 board feet of timber was \$501,484.60 or 31 per cent more than the appraised prices.

Nine of the 11 tracts offered consisted primarily of wind-, fire-, and insect-damaged timber that is being salvaged under BLM's current program to reduce undue loss of merchantable dead timber.

The next timber auction will be on October 9 at the office of the Salem Forest District, Bureau of Land Management, 460 North High street, Salem, Oregon.
